The kindergarten is a private Christian kindergarten, with a long day program for working parents, 7am to 6pm. Two teacher salaries are paid by the State, but the state provides no other money for equipment, maintenance, materials or utilities. It has been quite stressful since our volunteer Maria left in 2022. Maria opened reception for child drop-

off at 7am, and cleaned-up at the end of the day, with free time in the afternoon. Everyone has coped since Maria left, but this has meant working very long hours.

We don't have the exams and legal papers (or money) to become an employer and take on a paid assistant. We can only hope and pray for volunteers. Ed

We started a new year, with trust that God will provide all the needs for this great ministry to continue. Why? At the beginning of the new school year it was a fight for me to make all the papers and building work to obtain the licence from the Educational Services. It meant hard work and a lot of time to make everything. In addition to this we need to take some more exams and degrees, and we have our own kids and family...
